The term 'Stone Age' refers to a very long period of time that we can break up into three sections.

Lithic means stone age.

Palaeo – means early

Meso – means middle

Neo – means new

The period of prehistory in Britain generally refers to the time before written records began. It begins when the earliest hunter-gatherers lived in The Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age covers 98% of human history in Britain.

The evolution of humans from the earliest hominins to Homo sapiens occurred in this period.

Skara Brae is a prehistoric village found on the Orkney Islands, off the north coast of Scotland. It is a fascinating prehistoric village - built and occupied between 3000BC and 2500BC. It is one of the best preserved settlements from this time – artefacts such as the tool and crop remains show that the settlers were expert farmers as well as hunters and fishermen.



Britain.

Stonehenge is a prehistoric monument just North of Salisbury. It has a ring of standing stones that can still be seen today. However, its purpose and how it was built is still a mystery.

Some of the major advances in technology occurred during this period, including the control of fire, agriculture, metalworking and the wheel.
